Measures and Targets

An image of the chart on slide 4 is shown here. It contains the 2019 Quality Forum Plan CQMs in the order they will be discussed throughout the year. The Gold target is the HP2020 goal, if one exists. If the CQM doesn't have a HP2020 goal, the target is based on December 2018 performance of health centers using DRVS. The one exception is Dental Sealants as DRVS performance already exceeds the HP2020 goal. The Silver target is the HP2020 goal and the Gold target is greater than HP2020. There is no longer a Bronze target.



Well Women Measures

Refer to slides 7-17 for Breast Cancer Screening, Colorectal Cancer Screening, and Cervical Cancer Screening measure breakdowns and workflows. A workflow for HPV Vaccinations is included on slide 18. Note the key measure differences from prior year UDS below.

KDHE Early Detection Works (EDW) – Breast and cervical cancer education, screening, diagnosis, and referral are available for Kansas women who:

- are 40-64yrs for cervical cancer screenings or 45-64yrs for breast cancer screenings;
- do not have health insurance; and
- have a family income within program guidelines.

Melodie Reich stated that Salina Family Healthcare Center (SFHC) uses the EDW program extensively. They have found that funding is tight at the end of the year. Suggestion: get women into the program early in the year to ensure funds are available.

DRVS Alerts – Alerts available for the Patient Visit Planning and Care Management Passport reports include cervical cancer screening, colorectal cancer screening, mammogram, HPV immunization, tobacco status, and tobacco cessation. Note that there are 2 cervical cancer screening alerts available, but only 1 should be enabled. Alerts for mammogram and tobacco status are configurable.

Other Well Women Checks include depression screening, violence screening, pre-diabetes screening, LDL, vitals, skin cancer, and oral health. DRVS alerts are available for all of these except skin cancer checks.

Member Best Practice Spotlight

- Melodie Reich reported that SFHC is planning a “Smash and Dash” type of women-only event with a mobile mammogram van and vendors. Unfortunately, the van recently upgraded to take 3D images, which Medicaid and many other payers don’t cover. Another barrier is that the van requires that they have at least 20 women pre-scheduled for mammograms. They are looking at working with the hospital to do this event instead.
 - Mona stated that as of January 1, 2019, all Kansas insurance companies are mandated to cover 3D mammograms. The mobile mammogram company told SFHC that only 1 insurance company currently covered 3D images. EDW does not cover 3D mammograms.
- Maria Hensley reported that Health Partnership Clinic (HPC) has participated in an American Cancer Society (ACS) National Football League (NFL) Grant project. Through the grant, they were able to host events like the one Melodie described. Maria suggested looking into ACS grants for funding in future years. The grant doesn’t really match any of the age ranges of CMS measures. HPC used CMS125 that supports ages 50-74 to measure performance. This year, they’re participating in the Breast Health Equity ACS grant, which doesn’t require them to host well women days. This grant just counts services provided. They have a women’s health nurse practitioner. If you participate in EDW, you can run a mammogram campaign, which is paid for through the grant. One issue HPC found is that ACS doesn’t have a grant representative in their area, so they’re working with someone out of Denver to coordinate the grant. The grant helps pay for a nurse practitioner who performs the cancer screenings.

PDSA Brainstorming

HPC uses an eCW social history template they call “every patient every time”. This template helps them ensure that all measures are checked and they document it in one place. The template allows staff to document without having to bounce back and forth. PrairieStar has created a similar template that nurses use when they’re rooming patients. The nurse will document as much as they can prior to the doctor entering the room.
